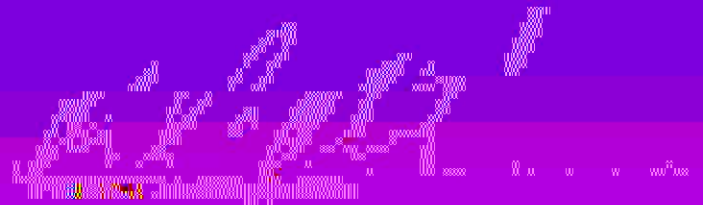

Funding:

Tuition waiver is funded through the university's general fund.

Out-Service training may be funded by the department's or Vice President's operating funds.
