\_\_\_\_\_ Fair use is more likely to apply when a work is used for a nonprofit, educational purpose such as teaching, research, scholarships, criticism, or comment. The use must also be transformative or have a productive use. In other words, the work is used to be commented on, criticized, remade as a parody, or repurposed so that the main idea behind it can be more easily identified. In addition, the work must have some type of restricted access so that only a specific group of people, such as students, are able to access it.

\_\_\_\_\_ – In order for a work to fully favor fair use, it must be a published work that is factual, or nonfiction, and be important to the course objectives. Consumable works, such as standardized tests and workbooks, will never qualify for fair use.
